Once we have reviewed the documents we will email (email address provided on your application) instructions to pre-enroll for fingerprints and to set up fingerprinting appointment.

- Applicant must be at least 21 years of age.
- Form DPS-799-C must be completed and <u>notarized</u>. The notarized date must be within 60 days of submission. You <u>must</u> use the <u>most recent</u> form (dated 08/04/2022 or newer) or it will <u>NOT be accepted</u>. The form can be found online from the State of CT Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection Special Licensing and Firearms Unit.

- Signed FBI Privacy Act Statement (forms available on webpage or in the EWPD lobby)

- Firearms Safety and Use Course Certificate must be submitted. On or after July 1, 2024, requires applicants to complete, within two years before submitting their applications, a DESPP-approved course on firearm safety and use which may include certified NRA courses or those offered by other organizations that are conducted by a certified NRA instructor or the state. The course must include instruction on state law's requirements for safe storage of firearms at home and in vehicles and lawful use of firearms and carrying them in public. - A recent passport type photograph (2x2 of face) must be attached to the application. No photocopies will be accepted. Must be photo paper No copy paper accepted.
- A <u>CERTIFIED</u> copy of your birth certificate must be attached to the application **OR** copy of current U.S. Passport to show proof you are legally and lawfully in the United States.
- Personal identification in the form of a government-issued photo ID (valid CT driver's license or CT State non-driver photo ID). ID's should show <u>current</u> address. Please make certain you have changed your address with the Department of Motor Vehicles. In CT you are required to change your address within 48 hours of moving.
- Proof of local residency in the form of a utility bill, tax bill, mortgage, lease, or rental agreement; or similar third-party document that clearly establishes the applicant's residency in East Windsor (not advertisement mail).
- The following one (1) separate check will be collected at time of fingerprints:
 - \$70.00 cashier's check or money order (payable to the East Windsor Police Department)
- No permit will be issued if the local authority has reason to believe the applicant has ever been convicted of a felony or that any other condition exists for which the issuance of a permit for possession of a pistol or revolver is prohibited (Suitability).
- State law requires fingerprinting and criminal history checks. Upon completion of the background investigation, you will either be contacted and issued a Temporary State Permit which is valid for 60 days **OR** you will receive written notice of rejection of the Temporary State Permit application.
